## **Press Release**

**4/25/2016 – 5/1/2016**

1. On 4/25 at 1501 received a report of a possible sick or rabid fox in the area of Bible Hill Road. Responded and met with the complainant. Searched the area and nothing was located. Cleared.
2. On 4/26 at 0800 received a report of a collision with a deer on Greenfield Road from the evening before. Reporting person advised that there was substantial damage the vehicle and the deer had expired. Responded to the area along Greenfield Road and located the deer. Requested New Hampshire DOT to respond for removal and provided the operator with a State Accident Form. Cleared.
3. On 4/27 at 1002 received a report of a medical emergency on Oak Hill Road. Emergency services responded to assist the patient.
4. On 4/27 at 1332 received a report of an E-911 activation from a vehicle through "On-Star". They indicated that the emergency activation was in the area of Sleeper Mill Lane area. Responded and checked the entire area and residences along Pleasant Pond and no vehicle located. Cleared.
5. On 4/28 at 1354 received a report of a single motor vehicle collision in the area of Greenfield Road and Farrington Road with personal injuries. Upon arrival the initial investigation indicated that the operator; Thierry Kianga-Mipapa age 45 of Manchester, New Hampshire was operating a 2006 Nissan Pathfinder westbound along Greenfield Road. The vehicle left the roadway impacting a tree where it came to final rest. Fracestown Rescue, Fire Department and ambulance responded to the scene. The operator was treated at the scene for non-life injuries and the male passenger was transported to the Monadnock Community Hospital for non-life injuries. The traffic collision is still under investigation and a causation factor has not been determined. The vehicle was towed from the scene.
6. On 4/28 at 1714 received a report of a speeding vehicle in the area of the 2<sup>nd</sup> NH Turnpike North. It was reported that the said vehicle almost struck a pedestrian as it operated southbound. Investigation is on-going to identify the operator.

7. On 5/1 at 1759 received a report of OHRV trespassing on the property owner in the Dennison Pond Road possible on the Weare side. Responded to the area and could not locate the operators. New Hampshire Fish and Game was notified and investigation is continuing.
