## Press Release

7/11/2016 – 7/24/2016

1. On 7/11 at 1511 hours received a report of a citizen welfare check in the area of Pleasant Pond Road. Police Department responded and made immediate contact with the person of concern. Cleared without further incident.
2. On 7/12 at 1440 hours received a report of a medical emergency in the area of Pleasant Pond Road. Emergency Services responded and made contact with the victim. No transport necessary and cleared with incident.
3. On 7/12 at 1401 hours received a report of suspicious activity in the area of Candlewood Hill Road with people being on a property. These individual were known to the Police Department. No action necessary.
4. On 7/12 at 1740 hours received residential alarm activation in the area of Poor farm Road. It was determined to be an accidental activation.
5. On 7/13 at 1013 hours received a request to contact an owner of a lost license plate who lived in the Poor Farm Road area. Contact made to owner.
6. On 7/13 at 1544 hours received a report of two canines running at large in the area of Journey's End Road. Upon arrival both canines secured and transported to the animal control officer. Follow-up investigation conducted on 7/14. The owner was identified and warned on violations of unrestrained and unlicensed canines. Cleared. Canines licensed with the next week.

Upon arrival it was determined that two (2) vehicles were in violation of the State Statute which prohibits parking within a travel portion of a travel lane obstructing the flow of traffic. The owners were contacted and explained the statute; vehicles removed.
10. On 7/19 at 1309 hours received a report of a medical emergency in the area of Greenfield Road for a nine (9) month old that had fallen and was experiencing breathing problems. Emergency Services arrived at 1311 hours and assistance was rendered to the victim. No transport necessary.

11. On 7/19 at 1442 hours received a report of two (2) suspicious vehicles in the area of Old County Road, description also given. Upon arrival the vehicles and owners identified. Cleared without further incident.
12. On 7/19 at 1712 hours received a report of automatic fire alarm activation in the area of Main Street. Emergency services responded and upon arrival the alarm was determined to be false.
13. On 7/20 at 1048 hours received a report of a motor vehicle complaint in the area of Benington Road. The reporting person stated that a vehicle was operating erratically all over the roadway. The vehicle was identified. Upon arrival in the area the vehicle was not located. The registered owner's resident was checked with no contact.

18. On 7/22 at 0226 hours received a report of a medical emergency in the area of Pleasant Pond Road for an 89 year old male difficulty breathing. Emergency Services responded and rendered assistance.
19. On 7/22 at 1711 received a citizen request for a VIN verification in the area of Poor Farm Road. Respond and assisted citizen. Cleared without further incident.
20. On 7/22 at 2250 hours received a report of several horses loose and on the complainant's property. The animal control officer was contacted and responded to the scene and addressed the issue.

On 7/23 at 1803 hours received a call from Hillsborough County Dispatch that as a result of the storm and high winds that just occurred, that several trees, electrical wires were down along with several street that were blocked and impassable. Emergency Services responded including, Bennington Fire (mutual aid), Francestown Fire and Rescue, Greenfield Police (mutual aid), Francestown Police and the Francestown Highway Department. Several roadways, including New Boston Road (in three locations) were blocked and impassable including one section on Pleasant Pond Road. The Francestown Highway Department checked all secondary roads, while removing any debris located in the roadway in town to insure that those roadways were passable. The law enforcement agencies assisted with traffic control in several areas of town.

21. On 7/23 at 2253 hours received a report of an abandoned 911 call in the area of Mountainside Lane. State Police advised.
22. On 7/23 at 2316 hours received a report of suspicious vehicle in the area of Scoby Road. State Police advised.
23. On 7/23 at 2358 hours received a report from a concerned citizen that a relative was over-due arriving home. Citizen advised that this was most likely due to the detours in town. Citizens insisted on speaking with a police officer, State Police advised.
24. On 7/24 at 0659 received a report of a minor motor vehicle collision with no personal injury in the area of New Boston Road. State Police advised.
