8/8/2016 – 8/14/2016

1. On 8/8 @ 1715 hours received complaint for an alleged child abuse incident. During investigation the complainant and accused were interviewed. No immediate threat was identified with the child and the case is suspended at this time.
2. On 8/8 @ 1806 hours received a complaint of an unrestrained canine located on Main Street. The canine was taken to the animal control officer's residence and secured. The owner was identified on 8/9 and issued a warning for unrestrained and unregistered canine.
3. On 8/10 @ 1823 complaint of three (3) vehicles parked on Bennington Road within the travel portion of the roadway. Owners were contacted and requested to move the vehicles. Cleared.
4. On 8/12 @ 1312 hours received a complaint of an attempted burglary in the area of Pleasant Pond Road area. The complainant reported that a male suspect approached the door in an attempt to gain entrance. State Police responded to the scene. The Fracestown Police Department in a follow-up investigation is continuing to investigate this incident in conjunction with the Lyndeborough and Deering Police Department. The suspect vehicle was described as being a red Honda; the male was described as being a black male who was bald wearing a grey shirt with blue sleeves, shorts and sneakers. The passenger in the suspect vehicle was described as being a white female and the vehicle was last observed by witnesses heading north on Pleasant Pond Road towards Deering. Investigation is continuing. Anyone having any information is asked to contact the Fracestown police Department at 547-2043 or the New Hampshire State Police.
5. On 8/14 @ 0725 hours received alarm activation on Main Street. State Police advised.
6. On 8/14 @ 1803 received a call for medical assistance on Poor Farm Road for an elderly female with possible heat exhaustion. Emergency Services responded to the scene and assisted the patient.
